The Graduate Student Fellowship Program of the American Museum of Natural History is an educational partnership with selected universities and is dedicated to the training of Ph. D. candidates in those scientific disciplines practiced at the Museum. The university exercises educational jurisdiction over the Program and awards the degree. The Museum curator serves as a graduate advisor, co-major professor or major professor. The student benefits by having the staff and facilities of both the university and the Museum in order to carry on his/her training and research. Joint programs include:

- Columbia University, providing student opportunities in anthropology, vertebrate and invertebrate paleontology, earth and planetary sciences, astrophysics and evolutionary biology (Center for Environmental Research and Conservation),
- Cornell University, providing student opportunities in entomology,
- City University of New York, providing student opportunities in evolutionary biology, systematics and biological anthropology,
- Yale University, providing student opportunities in molecular biology and systematics.

Fellowships cover stipend and health insurance, and awards are for one year, renewable annually for up to a maximum of four years. This program is not open to Master's Degree candidates.

APPLICATION GUIDELINES

Applicants must submit **ten copies** of this form and ten copies of the required information to the address above by **November 30** or application materials will be returned. Applicants are responsible for fulfilling application requirements and gaining acceptance to one of the four universities listed above. Those students already enrolled at one of the above universities and applying to the program for the first time must demonstrate that they are in good standing at their schools.

All applications should be discussed with appropriate curator(s) before submission.
